Please note that the next Churchyard Cleanup will be on Saturday 5th October, from 10am to 1pm, elevenses and lunch included.



Jane Austen and Gothic Tourism: A Talk by Dr. Cheryl Butler

Join Dr. Cheryl Butler for a fascinating talk on literary icon Jane Austen in anticipation of the Jane Austen 250 programme in 2025! This fundraising event for Hampshire History Trust will take place on Friday 19 July at The ARC, Winchester from 7:30 -8:30pm.

The talk will focus on Austen's first novel "Northanger Abbey" and its connections with Gothic tourism. Dr. Butler will reflect on the author's love for gothic fiction and the public's interest in medieval ruins such as Hampshire's Netley Abbey where writers, poets, artists and tourists would visit in the hopes of seeing ghostly monks, and other apparitions.

As a contributing editor for the Southampton Record Series, Dr Butler's twin passion for history and drama have driven her work as a playwright, novelist and lecturer. She is a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society and a keen supporter of several heritage organisations.

Parish Council

Next Parish Council Meeting

The next Parish Council Meeting is on **18th July 2024** at 7.30pm.

Council meetings will take place in the Mosaic Room at the Memorial Hall Sparsholt.

Hedges

Hedges - the recent weather has generated more growth than usual at this time of the year. Can people who own hedges backing onto roads or footpaths please trim them to ensure the safety of pedestrians, horse riders and cyclists.

Dog Poo

Please clear up after your dogs- use bins provided or take their deposits home with you. It is not acceptable to hang bags on trees or bushes. When crossing fields please keep your dogs on leads. Harvesting will be happening shortly and dogs fouling the fields can cause contamination of the crops and a huge financial cost to the farmers.

Temporary closure of footpath



To allow works at a neighbouring property the footpath between Home Lane and Woodman Lane (opposite the shop) will be closed **from 8th July 2024 until 16th September 2024** (or until completion of the works, whichever is sooner).

Reminder Roadworks on Church Farm Lane

As the Church Farm Development nears completion the next stage is to upgrade Church Farm Lane. This is planned to take place during the school holidays to minimise disruption to the children during term time.

Circa 15th July a temporary trac-mat road will be laid in the paddock alongside the middle section of the Lane to by-pass most of the works to maintain access for Church Farm Cottages and sewerage works.

On Friday 2nd August and continuing over the weekend, the Woodman Lane end of the road will be upgraded with new tarmac laid on Monday 5th August. This is to get clear of the access to Manor Cottages in the speediest way. The footpath crossing the existing Lane between the village and Dean, will remain open for walkers but residents are reminded to be vigilant and keep dogs on leads when crossing the road.

Week commencing 2nd September Tarmac will be laid the whole length of the road from top of the Lane to Lower Barns entrance of the new development.

The Developer is aware of the likely disruption but will do their upmost to minimise the inconvenience.

Note Woodman Lane will not be closed during the works.

Reminder Roadworks Dean Lane

As part of the annual Planned Maintenance programme, this letter is to inform of upcoming drainage investigatory works in Dean Lane adjacent to the Dean Lane Farmhouse Access.

The works are programmed to start on Monday 15th July 2023 and are expected to last for up to 5 days, during which time the road will be closed to vehicular traffic 24hours a day, with working hours between 07:30 - 18:00hrs. Local access will be maintained for residents and businesses where possible.


