Instant coffee	Canned meats (spam, curries, stewed meats, chilli, corned beef)
Cereals	Tinned custard
Granulated sugar	Biscuits
Squash	Toilet rolls
Pot noodles	Table sauces (ketchup, brown sauce, mayo and salad cream)

The Beacon has also requested various meat items which would not be suitable for bringing to, or leaving in, the Church. If you would like to consider providing assistance towards the purchase of fresh or frozen meat items, a financial donation would be more suitable, allowing The Beacon staff to use it to buy the meat, as and when they need it. Winchester City Council Councillors' Report

Local Plan

We have an urgent and important opportunity for all Parish Councils to comment on the **Winchester District Draft Reg 19 Local Plan** and the proposed NPPF consultation which is driving the Government's request for an addition al 4,800 houses in our district.

The WCC consultation is now open, and you can find all of the information on the local plan website Have your say - Winchester District Local Plan and will be open until 13th October.

Comments are being collected using Citizenspace – this way we can be sure they are received in the right format for the planning inspector – as at Regulation 19, comments received during consultation are also sent in full directly to the Inspector.

Proposed reforms to the National Planning Policy Framework and other changes to the planning system

This consultation is seeking views on the government's proposed approach to revising the NPPF. It also seeks views on a series of wider national planning policy reforms. Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct review will be finalised by the City Council in November with a request post that agreement for all Parish Councils to also adopt the same format. The code is based on the Local government model and will aid governance for all at a local level if parishes and the city council use the same document.

Update on bin collection re-routes.

The Council is still on target to make changes to collections week commencing 7th October. Residents will start receiving their calendars and letters with information about the changes towards the end of this week and we will be starting communications letting them know to expect their new calendar in the post. These changes will help us cut carbon, increase recycling and improve efficiency. We'll be driving fewer miles each week and cutting carbon emissions. This aligns with our ambition of being a carbon neutral district by 2030 - we've already reduced emissions by up to 94% by switching to hydrotreated vegetable oil fuel from diesel. And we're introducing the council's first fully electric waste and recycling vehicle. We can ensure a continued, efficient and reliable service in the future and we can prepare to increase recycling collections (such as food waste recycling) without having to make further changes.

WCC Residents Survey

A WCC Residents Survey was completed at the beginning of September. Results for the Wonston & Micheldever ward will be available for us all to see next month and will update us on the views of local residents about the services the Council provides.

Facial Recognition

Last week as part of an ongoing commitment to remove offenders from our communities and to keep the public safe, Hampshire and the Isle of Wight constabulary carried out an operation using **live facial recognition (LFR)** technology alongside traditional policing tactics. This was the first time this has been used in Hampshire. The vans were in Portsmouth, Southampton, Basingstoke and Winchester. Images of people the Police wanted to speak to were added to a bespoke 'watch list' that was unique to the operation. The technology uses live video footage of crowds passing a camera and compares the image to the list. Any image that does not cause an alert is automatically and immediately deleted. No personal data is stored.

Locally the bins in Woodman Close have been partially sorted. We are following up with officers regarding the outstanding items.

Latest news regarding the Solar Farm Application

Despite considerable local objections, the application was very narrowly approved by Winchester City Council Planning Committee; with 4 votes in support and 4 against. The Chair of the planning committee then used her casting vote to approve the planning application. Work is likely to start early in 2025.

Hampshire County Council Councillor's Report

Local Plan -need for infrastructure

Although the preparation of a local plan is role of the City Council, the sudden change in housing allocations announced by the new government will have a significant impact on local infrastructure. This will include plans for roads, school places, flooding mitigation and drainage that are the responsibility of the county council.

The final draft of the Winchester local plan allocating new homes is based on the previous government's housing allocation and will be open for public comment until 13th October (see link below), before being submitted for inspection. As soon as this new plan is adopted the City Council will be expected to start work on a revised plan to include the uplifted allocation of house numbers.

Solar Together

Hampshire's solar energy group-buying scheme, offered by independent experts iChoosr and promoted by Hampshire County Council, enables residents to invest in solar panels for their homes, fitted by pre-vetted installers, to reduce reliance on the national grid and lower their energy bills, as well as boost local renewable energy generation.

Through Solar Together, over 28,400 solar panels have already been installed in Hampshire – it is estimated that these installations alone will reduce carbon emissions by 59,205 tonnes over 25 years – equivalent to taking over 32,600 cars off the road during the same period.

Devolution

An expression of interest in a regional political agreement (combined authority) was submitted on 30th August by Hampshire County Council and the three Solent unitary authorities (Portsmouth, Southampton and Isle of Wight). The agreement would respect existing boundaries and could attract additional powers and economic funding.

Children's Services

Hampshire's Children's services were rated outstanding by Ofsted this summer. The timely and robust practice of social workers ensure vulnerable children are kept safe and families receive appropriate and effective support.

In the summer break we welcomed back our Year 11 students to receive their GCSE results. Please see the highlights below: -

The Henry Beaufort School are celebrating an outstanding set of results for a wonderful group of young people. These positive outcomes are their passport to higher and further education.

Students who attended our school have delivered superb headlines in all subject areas. 30% of all the GCSE results were at grade 7 or better.

Our core subject results are as follows: -

Subject/ Grade	4 or better	5 or better	7 or better
English	88%	78%	38%
Maths	85%	66%	21%
Students achieving both English and maths	81%	60%	19%

In science 88% of students attained two grade 4s or above and 82% at least one grade 4 or above.

Other subjects of note for the percentage of students attaining a Grade 5 or above:

- Biology 85%, Chemistry 81% and Physics 84%
- Food 78%
- French 88%
- Health and Social Care 72%
- Music 100%
- RE 70%
- Spanish 88%
- Statistics 93%

This was day of celebration for the whole school community.

Open Mornings are being held on the following dates at the school: -

12th and 13th of September, the 3rd and 17th of October. There is also an Open Evening on the 12th of September.

This is an opportunity for parents of children in Primary School to bring their children to see our school in action. We look forward to welcoming you.
